#### 1. UCI Regulations:

The competition will be conducted under the rules and regulations established by the Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI). It is imperative that all participants familiarize themselves with and adhere to the UCI Regulations throughout the duration of the competition. Only athletes with at least 10 points in the UCI ranking on the day of the event will be admitted to participate in Class 1 events, following the provisions of Article 3.8.003 of the UCI Track Regulations.

#### 2. Competition Regulations:

Fiorenzuola International Track is a UCI Class 1 event for Olympic races (Omnium – Madison) and Class 2 for other races. Participation is open for Men Elite, Women Elite, Men Under 23, and Women Under 23. The races award points for track nations and individual classifications, following the provisions of Articles 3.3.002 and 3.3.010 of the UCI Track Regulations.

#### 3. Special Madison Regulation:

The UCI Class 1 Madison Final Classification will comprise points gained in the SGR Madison and SGR Flying Lap during the three days of races. Points are assigned as specified below:

- Madison: 20-12-10-8-6-4
- Flying Lap: 10-6-5-4-3-2

Madison Final: All sprints' points (and 20 points for laps gained or lost) will go directly to the UCI Class 1 final Madison classification.

#### 4. Competition Programme and Schedule:

The competition schedule, including race categories, start times, and durations, is detailed in the official program. Participants and teams should review the schedule to be well-prepared for their respective events. The program, along with any specific modifications or communications, will be distributed via the official organization channels. The organization will communicate the confirmation of the next day's program or any changes daily, considering weather forecasts, qualifications for races, and other relevant situations.

#### 5. Communication Policy:

During the competition, official communications will be held within the official WhatsApp Channel [link], and the official website ([www.fiorenzuolatrack.eu](http://www.fiorenzuolatrack.eu)). Social media accounts associated with the event will serve only promotional and informational purposes for the general public. Information provided on Instagram, Facebook, X, Threads is not considered official. Official information will be distributed through the WhatsApp channel and the official website for team managers and athletes. A specific WhatsApp group will be created for organizational information (meal reservations, general information). For further information, contact the event director or the secretariat.

#### 6. Track Description:

The event will take place on an outdoor concrete track with a length of 394 meters and a maximum inclination of 33°. The track surface coating is concrete.

## 7. Training Schedule:

June 29th - July 4th, 9:00 - 11:00\*, June 29<sup>th</sup> – July 3<sup>rd</sup> 16:00 - 18:00. Note that healthcare service is not guaranteed during the training sessions. For information or assistance during training, refer to the team relations manager, Jan Kopac (+420 72404857).

## 8. Venue Information:

Below are key locations for the event.

- Competition Headquarters: Located under the grandstands, at the back where the gray door is (beside the restrooms). It hosts the media center, conference room, and the commissaire's office.

- Confirmation Area: Inside the velodrome, near the red building. It hosts all race confirmations and numbers distribution.

- Doping Control Station: Situated near the main entrance, in the building at the left.

- Media Centre: In the same place as the Headquarters.

- Direction Office: Located in the side part of the track, accessible only with a reservation from the director or the secretariat.

Additionally, all staff members wearing white polo shirts with the "6 giorni" logo are prepared to provide participants with any necessary information.

## 9. Starters Confirmation and Rider Numbers Distribution:

Participants must confirm their starters at the confirmation area on the same day as the event, until one hour before the beginning of the first daily session. Rider numbers will be distributed at the same location and time following confirmation. The specific time is indicated in the race programme.

## 10. Team Managers Meeting:

The meeting for Team Managers will take place online via Google Meet on [Date and Time]. Attendance is mandatory.

## 11. Official Ceremonies Programme:

The award ceremony will take place immediately after the end of the races, on the podium inside the track. If, for any reason, the ceremony must be rescheduled, the organization will provide information as soon as possible. In any case, riders involved must present themselves in race clothing.

## 12. Prizes:

The prize money for Class 1 races follows UCI financial obligations, with principles of gender equality. Prizes are awarded to the first three classified of the final classification of each race. The prize money for Class 1 Omnium is: 1st place €200 - 2nd place €150 - 3rd place €100. The prize money for Class 1 Madison race is: 1st place €1000 (500€ for each team member) - 2nd place €600 (300€ for each team member) - 3rd place €200 (100€ for each team member) since the race takes place on multiple days. The single races which compose the SGR Madison (Day 1 Madison, Day 1 Flying Lap, Day 2 Madison, Day 2 Flying Lap, will give a 200€ bonus prize (100€ for each team member) for each team member. The prize money for Class 2 races, following the principles of gender equality, is: 1st place €100.00 - 2nd place €60.00 - 3rd place €40.00, for each race. Prize money will be paid via bank transfer at the end of the event. In order to collect it, athletes must fill out the prize money form in all parts and send it to the organization team; otherwise, the money prize can't be disposed.

13. Press:

Media are allowed in the infield zone of the track only with organization media accreditations. Media accreditation can be collected during the opening hours of the media center, located under the stands, accessible exclusively for accredited journalists during the scheduled opening time. Press accreditation is open until June 28th via email to [6giornidellerose@gmail.com](mailto:6giornidellerose@gmail.com). Media Center will open everyday at 4pm.

14. UCI Scale of Penalties:

Only the UCI Scale of Penalties shall apply for any infractions during the competition.

15. Environmental Policy:

We are committed to promoting sustainable practices and reducing our environmental impact. Some of the actions that will be taken during the event include:

- Minimization of Paper Usage:

We will minimize the use of paper by digitizing documents and communications. Updates and relevant information will be made available exclusively through electronic means.

- Waste Separation:

We will provide bins for separate waste collection at strategic points. We kindly ask all participants to actively collaborate by separating waste according to the provided guidelines.

- Dining Area without Single-Use Utensils and Tablecloths:

In the athlete, organization, and commissaires' dining area, we will avoid the use of single-use utensils and tablecloths. Reusable and sustainable solutions will be adopted to reduce the consumption of non-recyclable materials.

We are truly convinced that, through the collaboration of participants, we can make our event increasingly sustainable. Your active involvement and adherence to these policies are crucial for the success of this ecological initiative. As part of our ongoing commitment, we aim to offset the carbon footprint of the event in the future. Your continued support will help us achieve this goal.
